

REFERENCE SERVICES

The reference area covers a broad range of standard reference works and several specialized collections that can be used in the library. Questions may be asked in person, by telephone at 609-463-6350 x400, or by filling out the online form "Ask a Librarian" on the website. If the material or information requested is not available through the library's print online or digital collection, the reference staff can usually acquire it from another library.

ONLINE DATABASES

The library offers over 60 online databases including: Ancestry, an Auto Repair resource, Philadelphia Inquirer, Press of Atlantic City, Access World News, Ebsco Magazine Index, Mango Languages, Rosetta Stone Library Solution Plus, Learning Express Library, NoveList Plus, and many more. All are available in the library and most are available for home use with a valid library card.

NEWSPAPER DATABASES

The library has access to the electronic editions of some local newspapers. Newspapers include: The Press of Atlantic City, 1988-current; Philadelphia Inquirer, 1981-current; selections from local Gazette Newspapers, and other titles.

LOCAL HISTORY

The library has a collection of books, newspapers, microfilm, and pamphlets about Cape May County and New Jersey. The library is preserving local history by digitizing these items. Please see Cape May County History Online located in the Genealogy category of the library website's Research page.

THE INTERNET

The Internet is available on most of the library's public computers and free wireless access is offered at every location.

USING THE LIBRARY FROM HOME

The library catalog and many of the databases can be accessed from home with a library card barcode number. Through the catalog, patrons can request and renew items and edit a patron record.

MIFI WIRELESS HOTSPOTS

The library offers a collection of MiFi wireless hotspots available at all locations. MiFi wireless hotspots check out for 7 days with no renewals. These items can be placed on request. Some restrictions apply. Please see the Fines section for more information.

MATERIALS & POLICIES

LIBRARY CARDS

Library cards are available to county residents as well as visitors. All cards are good for one year. Please check with any location for details.

BORROWING AND RETURNING MATERIALS

Most materials may be checked out for 28 days. If an item is not on request, and renewals are available, it may auto-renew for an additional loan period. Some items can be renewed a second time. Select items, such as new books, requested items, special project books, equipment, and inter-library loan items may not be renewed.

BOOK DROP

The book drop is always open at most locations. If the book drop is locked, please return items inside. If the library and book drop are open, please return discs to the Circulation Desk.

FINES

The library charges fines for some materials returned late.

- Most Cape May County Library items do not accrue late fines.
- ILL items will continue to accrue late fines.

Adult accounts with over \$15 in late fines or other fees will be unable to register for events or check out materials until charges are below \$15. Juvenile patrons may continue to check out select materials with account fees over \$15, but under \$50.

MATERIALS & POLICIES (continued)

LOST OR DAMAGED MATERIALS

Items that have not been returned for 21 days after the final due date will be considered lost and replacement costs will be charged to a patron's account. This applies to all materials, including Children's and Teen items. Accounts with fees equaling \$50 or more are sent to a collection agency, excluding juvenile accounts.

The library does not accept replacement copies for lost or damaged items. The library will find the best price for a replacement copy and patrons are responsible for that cost plus a \$3 nonrefundable processing fee. Payment for lost materials will be refunded up to 12 months from the date charged if materials are later returned in good condition.

NOTICES

Patrons who have placed items on request will be notified when the items become available to borrow. Patrons can choose to receive notices via telephone call, email, or text message. Overdue notices and bills will be sent via print mail, email, or text. The library can send email or text notices when items are almost due.

DIGITAL COLLECTIONS

The library's digital collection includes thousands of adult, teen, and children's fiction and nonfiction titles. The library offers downloadable eBooks and eAudios, streaming music, movies, and TV shows. These services are available by visiting the Borrow pages through the Menu on the library website. Please call the TLC at (609)463-6350 x600 for assistance borrowing digital materials. Requests to add eBook and eAudio titles to the collection can be placed by filling out the online Request a Book form on the catalog.

MATERIALS & POLICIES (continued)

DVDS, VIDEO GAMES, AND AUDIOBOOKS

Entertainment and informational DVDs check out for 7 days with 1 renewal. New DVDs check out for 2 days and are not renewable. Video games check out for 14 days and are not renewable. Audiobooks on CD and Playaways check out for 28 days with 1 renewal.

LIBRARY OF THINGS

The library offers a collection of non-traditional items through the Library of Things. Materials include: ukuleles, cake pans, knitting loom, Nintendo Switch consoles, metal detector, and a variety of other items. Please search "Library of Things" in the online catalog to see a full list. Library of Things materials check out for 14 days with no renewals and do accrue overdue fines.

REQUESTS AND INTER-LIBRARY LOANS

If the library has an item but it is checked out, patrons can request that the item be held when it is returned. Patrons may also request that items be brought from another Cape May County Library location. The library will notify patrons when the item is held and the item will be held for 5 days. Patrons can place requests on items in the library or online through the catalog or app.

If the library does not own a desired item, please fill out a request online using the Request an Item form. The library may purchase the item for the collection or borrow it from another library through inter-library loan (ILL). ILL materials may only be checked out for 7 or 14 days and may not be renewed. ILL items do accrue overdue fines. Repeated overdue, lost, or damaged ILL materials may result in the loss of ILL privileges. Unfortunately, the library is unable to borrow from other libraries for patrons with Visitor cards.
